## **Players**

**Boismortier** was born in the south of France. Little is known of his youth and musical training. He relocated to Paris in about 1724 and was among the most popular composers of 18th-century France.

**Lope** seems to have been from Spain, but we have been unable to find biographical information for him.

**Schickhardt** was born in Germany. He performed on the recorder and the oboe, and served in a number of positions and locations. Schickhardt also produced instruction manuals for the instruments he played.

**Forqueray** was a French composer and virtuoso of the viola da gamba. Marin Marais and he were considered by their contemporaries as the two greatest virtuosi of the viola da gamba.

**Telemann** was one of the most prolific composers in history, and was considered by his contemporaries to be the leading German composer of his time.

**Scarlatti** was born in Sicily. He gained the protection of Queen Christina of Sweden (who at the time was living in Rome), and became her maestro di cappella. His son, Domenico, also became a composer.
